

FOR A FAMILY LIVING IN POVERTY-ia lack of simple items such as hygiene products and school-approved attire, can keep children out of school for days, even weeks. For these children, lost school time means lost learning time, which can leave them less likely to achieve academic success.

HOW IT WORKS - Elementary students are introduced to The Nurse's Pantry through school nurses, principals and guidance counselors. In addition to attire, The Nurse's Pantry also provides hygiene items, appropriate footwear, outerwear, undergarments and lice treatment kits.


